Project Goals:

- Streamline the process. Make the production process smooth and efficient. Efficiency makes profits.
- Educate the customer. Be thoughtful and helpful so the customer understands how your services can make their life easier and more efficient.
- Focus on technology. Show the customer that your company is on the leading edge of technology . . . I want to hear them say "I didn't realize you could do that!"

Architectural Concept:

- Use 11" x 17" mirror panels with binary vowels that project onto adjacent walls, floor and ceiling.
- Create an "atmosphere" of duplication and project light as the message.
- Place the space. The big "D" with GPS positioning marks the exact office location in the universe.
- Space, color and lighting redefines the production area as the clean, accurate, sophisticated, high tech heart of the operation.
- The design goal is to create a staff recruitment tool, a marketing identity and a memorable client experience.
- We have proven that design affects the bottom line.

Word Paintings:

- Through my eyes you are organizing and moving letters and words and sentences and paragraphs and pages and chapters and volumes...
- Your technology transforms our language . . . the vowels of the English language look like this a, e, i, o, u. The new language is changed to binary and then changed back to English . . . and it looks like this . . . 001 100.
- Our concept takes these thoughts . . .adds a little magic . . . and becomes a memorable symbol of ImageNet.
- Our concept is called "Ditto". . . "meaning the same as before."


